| Service Name | Service Definition |
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| Activities Helping Youth Transition to Post- Secondary Education and Training | Transition planning activities such as career exploration, preparing and submitting college applications, learning about legal responsibilities after turning 18, and developing a portfolio. |
| Adult Basic Education | Engaged in an adult basic skills/education activity. Includes Title II funded adult education. |
| Adult Mentoring | Engaged in the pairing of a skilled or experienced adult with the youth to help him/her succeed. |
| Alternative Secondary School Offerings | The youth is engaged in approved secondary education other than a public High School. (GED/HSED) |
| Apprenticeship | Program approved/recorded by the ETA/Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training or State Apprenticeship Agency. Approval is by certified registration or other appropriate written credential. |
| Career Development | Engaged in career-planning and employment counseling, beyond regular appointments. |
| Comprehensive Guidance and Counseling | Engaged in counseling to address barriers that affect Youth Program participation. |
| Design Framework: Assessment | Identifies a youth as needing a comprehensive assessment to determine the needs of the youth. |
| Design Framework: Case Management | Identifies a youth as needing coordination of the multiple educational, employment, and supportive services necessary to achieve goals. |
| Design Framework: Individual Service Strategy | Identifies a youth as needing service plan leading toward job goals, achievement objectives, and/or educational goals. |
| Dropout Prevention Strategies | Engaged in strategies to help a youth continue to work toward a high school diploma or an equivalent. |
| Education Offered Concurrently with Workforce Preparation Activities | Integrated education and training model that provides adult education and literacy activities with workforce preparation activities. |
| Entrepreneurial Skills Training | Entrepreneurial skills training provides the basics of starting and operating a small business. |
| Financial Education | Engaged in training to improve financial literacy or personal budgeting skills. |
| Incentives | Payment for achievement of a specific and measurable goal. |
| Instruction Leading to Secondary School Completion | Any academic training required to meet graduation requirements. |
| Internships | Engaged in a short-term work experience to gain experience in a specific field. |
| Job Corps (co-enrolled in Youth Program) Job Search | Participating in services funded by the Job Corps program. Engaged in employment search. |
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| Job Shadowing | Engaged in an activity which provides exposure to an occupation(s) through observation. |
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| Leadership Development | Engaged in activities that provide the opportunity to take on new roles and responsibility. |
| Needs Related Payments | Eligible customer receiving service the WDB approved Needs Related Payments Policy. |
| Non WIOA Funded Post-Secondary Education | The youth participant enrolled in non WIOA funded post- secondary education after program entry. |
| Non WIOA Funded Secondary Education | The youth participant enrolled in non WIOA funded secondary education after program entry. |
| Occupational Skill Training | Engaged in classroom or job site training leading to a specific occupational skill. |
| On-the-Job Training | Engaged in a subsidized contract to employ/train; with unsubsidized employment the goal. |
| Paid Work Experience | Engaged in paid learning experience that takes place in the workplace for a limited time. |
| Parental Skills Training | Engaged in classroom instruction to improve parenting skills. |
| Planned Gap in Service | Participant has a planned gap in service due to a delay before the beginning of training - or a health/medical condition that prevents an individual from participating. |
| Pre-apprenticeship Programs | Provide strategies to prepare youth to succeed in a registered apprenticeship program(s). |
| Services Providing Labor Market and Employment Information in the Local Area | May include career awareness, career counseling, career exploration services or in-demand industry sectors or occupations available in local area. |
| Stipends | A fixed, regular small payment for successful participation in and completion of education or training services. |
| Study Skills Training | The youth is engaged in activities designed to help the individuals study habits. |
| Summer Youth Employment Opportunities | Engaged in employment during school summer break that link academic and occupational learning. |
| Supportive Services | Receiving services needed to participate in program activities. |
| Tutoring | Engaged in activities assisting individuals who need help with the subject content. |
| Unpaid Work Experience | Engaged in a structured unpaid learning experience at a workplace for a limited period. |
| Unsubsidized Employment | The youth is engaged in a job that is not subsidized. |
| Work Readiness | The youth is engaged in activities that prepare the individual for the world of work. |
| YouthBuild (co-enrolled in Youth Program) | Participating in services funded by the YouthBuild grant. |
